And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased. -HEBREWS 13:16 was quite the year. As many areas of the world were inundated with destructive winds and water, others suffered from lack thereof. As the drought occurred in conflict zones there were incidents where access to food aid was denied. CRWRF was blessed with your prayers and responses to requests for financial support. We were grateful to be able to work with reliable, Christian partners, including Middle East Reformed Fellowship and World Renew, in the distribution of aid in frequently difficult, high-risk situations.

2017 also saw the beginning of new relationships related to our work in Kenya. While we continue to work with Red een Kind on a child-focused community development project in the Achego community, we began relating directly with the African Inland Church's Children's Department regarding Achego, Tumaini and Mufu Rescue Centres. The Edmonton-based Manna group decided to become part of CRWRF, acting as western representatives and continuing to raise sponsorships and support for children in the Mufu Centre. All this occurred while we also transitioned to a new sponsorship coordinator in Ontario. God has been gracious in providing CRWRF with new people to fill these and other vacancies.

Behind the scenes there was also much activity. A new secretary and Southern Africa representative were introduced to their roles. Our Global Awareness Education continues to get more attention as the Grade 8 Geography resource called 'Open Doors' was used in many schools. Work was undertaken to refresh and update our website and increase the use of Facebook and Instagram. We completed our first year partnering with the Board of Mission Aid (Smithville) and applied to have our charitable status transferred to our newly incorporated organization.

Though all this was made possible by the generosity of supporting churches, donors and volunteers, we bow our heads in prayer and thank the Lord, knowing that He has provided it through you.

By having concern for these, they come to a greater understanding of what it means to show Christ's love.

Impact Story Milk & Diapers Program

Partner – World Renew

with World Renew provides us with an understanding of the extent of the ongoing needs of Syrian refugees in Lebanon. The conflict still rages on in Syria, and families have been forced to leave behind their stable lives in Syria - including homes, jobs, schooling, etc. They have had to start over in Lebanon in difficult and unstable living conditions, resulting in much pressure and distress. The need for assistance outweighs the available resources, and only the most vulnerable benefit from food assistance or the Milk & Diapers program. The story of Joram and Areej reflects the dire situation of many displaced persons in Lebanon, but it is also a story of the hope they have for the future because they benefited from programs supported by CRWRF contributions.

Joram and Areej are from Idlib in northwestern Syria. They fled their

home in 2014 after government forces began bombing the airport near their house. The trek across the mountains took four days. When they arrived in Lebanon, life was still not easy – Joram and Areej saw difficulty and challenges all around them, and often felt discouraged and tired. Joram works hard, performing any kind of labour that will help them to survive.

Joram and Areej and their family are very thankful that the church has been able to provide for some of their needs. They have been receiving a food box each month for six months, as well as diapers and one bag of milk per month from the Milk & Diapers program. We praise God for the funds which we have been able to contribute to support them and many other families, as they try to rebuild their lives.



We provided, and continue to provide, ongoing assistance to the most vulnerable Syrian refugees in Lebanon: mothers with very small children.

NIGERIA

PARTNERS: World Renew, **Canadian Foodgrains** Bank, and ZOA (Netherlands)

AMOUNT: \$15,000

With nearly half a million children at risk of famine in Nigeria, the scale of the need is massive and support is needed to continue this response.

HAITI

PARTNERS: World Renew, and locals AMOUNT: \$51,700

After Hurricane Matthew we worked to provide food assistance and a supply of seeds for farmers. The rehabilitation phase of this project provided materials and construction assistance to allow durable shelter repairs for 750 households.



LEBANON

PARTNERS: World Renew, local partner LSESD (Lebanon), and local churches AMOUNT: \$91,000



Our total expenses for the year were \$888,316. This left us a revenue shortfall of \$82,694. We have had surpluses over the prior years so there was no problem covering the expenses. The chart illustrates where we have disbursed the monies we received in 2017.
