

# 2021 CRWRF PROJECT TIMELINE

This timeline shows where your donations have helped people around the world in 2021, and provides information about the projects we supported.

## WINTER | 2021



**Yemen**  
\$25,000 for emergency food assistance. Project ran from October 2020 until June 2021, but we became involved early in 2021. More than 15,000 individuals benefited from this project funded by CRWRF and several other organizations.



**Philippines**  
\$15,000 for earthquake relief. Assistance was provided to 3,700 people.



**Nigeria**  
\$25,000 for Covid relief which provided food assistance through cash distribution to families. Helped 9,202 people.

## SPRING | 2021



**Lebanon**  
\$4,700 sent to fund distribution of milk, diapers and feminine pads for up to 400 families. CRWRF has contributed, and continues to contribute, towards multiple phases of this project in partnership with World Renew.



**Haiti**  
\$500 in funding for Haitian women's micro-financing program, through World Renew partnership; helped 25 women.



**Central African Republic (CAR)**  
\$12,700 for emergency food relief, needed due to government unrest and blockade in the capital city Bangui. Project ran from March to June 2021, and funded food parcels for 50 families.



**Ethiopia**  
\$700 to Samaritan's Purse to help in the deployment of their Disaster Assistance Response Team. Project began in April 2021, with no designated end.

## SUMMER | 2021



**Timor-Leste**  
\$26,800 in Cyclone Seroja relief funding (Phase 1) to provide 300 food and hygiene packages, generators, and water tanks.



**Democratic Republic of Congo**  
\$25,100 to provide assistance needed due to flooding and food shortages. Project ran from April to June 2021, providing food parcels to 200 people.



**Senegal**  
\$8,100 via World Renew for Covid-related support of Healthy Families and Communities.



**Timor-Leste**  
\$25,800 in Cyclone Seroja relief funding (Phase 2) to provide 300 food and hygiene packages, a stove, and sleeping mats.



**India**  
\$25,000 in partnership with World Renew via Evangelical Fellowship of India Commission on Relief. Project period: from May to July 2021. Focused on providing emergency cash transfers for Covid relief, Covid health education, and vaccine advocacy. The aim is to serve 5,495 families. Our contribution was part of a larger World Renew project.

## AUTUMN | 2021



**Haiti**  
\$31,400 in earthquake relief funding, to provide emergency non-food items such as blankets, kitchen sets, and shelters. Project ran from August to October 2021, and provided assistance to 13,000 individuals.



**India**  
\$22,400 in partnership with the Presbyterian Church of Central India. Project ran from September to November 2021. Focus was on Covid relief (masks, sanitizers, vaporizers, and thermometers).



**Nigeria**  
\$20,000 for emergency food assistance programming via cash transfers. Program ran from August 2021 to February 2022. Project reporting is not in yet, but the aim was to assist 12,630 people.



**Timor-Leste**  
\$86,000 for Cyclone Seroja relief funding (towards a total of \$138,000 in Phase 3 funding). Phase 3 aims to assist in home repairs, rebuilding of the New Girls Dormitory, and church renovations, and runs from October 2021 into 2022.



**Canada**  
Flood relief funds totalling \$1,024,000 collected and distributed to meet the essential and immediate needs, and restore basic livelihoods, of those directly affected by the flooding.



**Lebanon**  
\$40,800 installment towards Milk, Diapers & Feminine Pads project commitment

# BOARD REPORTS

## SECRETARY

As we’ve traveled through 2021, we engaged in relief projects around the world and close to home. CRWRF continued to engage in relief projects having to do with Covid-19 and its global effects, mainly providing health education and supplies to countries in hard-hit areas. We were also involved in providing relief to individuals in countries hit with food shortages, floods, cyclones, and earthquakes. CRWRF had the opportunity to work with new and old partners in order to help individuals in many countries around the world, and closer to home in British Columbia. The timeline shows a more in-depth overview of the different ways in which CRWRF was able to aid different countries in their circumstances by providing food, shelter, hygiene items, and/or building funds to rebuild homes and/or livelihoods.

This year CRWRF engaged in a unique relief project where we assisted our own donors at home in Canada, and others in their communities. Flood relief funds were sent in from across Canada to help southern British Columbia recover from the devastating effects of the flooding that damaged homes and livelihoods. We continue to pray that God will uphold them in the rehabilitation and rebuilding process in these communities.

If you are interested in the projects CRWRF engages in, we would recommend picking up the devotional we produced recently, *Cast Your Bread Upon the Waters*, as it provides a detailed and informative look into whom CRWRF helps. It is our hope and prayer that as 2022 progresses, CRWRF will be able to aid those who are suffering, so that these individuals might experience the loving hands of our God through CRWRF’s contribution to various relief projects.

## TREASURER

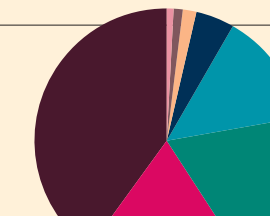

What a blessing it is to be reminded of this truth. As board and administration of CRWRF, what we have witnessed again in the past year was a compassionate response by our donor base in sharing their blessings and helping alleviate the distress of many in need. The resources provided to us allowed us to increase program spending by 9% over the previous year, with a substantial increase in Relief & Rehabilitation spending up to \$361K as many needs were addressed. The accompanying charts give an overview of the aid provided and the sources of the funds entrusted to us for this work. The strong support that CRWRF continues to receive allows the board to investigate new opportunities to show love and compassion to our needy neighbours around the world.

It is our hope and prayer that the peace Isaiah refers to in chapter 26:3 may be experienced by our supporters and by those we support, by the grace of our heavenly Father. — MIKE DE BOERSAP
